Six Hats, Six Colours

Blue Hat is cool, and it is also the colour of the sky which is above everything else. The blue hat is concerned with control, the organization of the thinking process, and the use of other hats.

White Hat is neutral and objective. The white hat is concerned with facts and figures.

Yellow Hat is sunny and positive. The yellow hat is optimistic and covers hope and positive thinking. It is creative, innovative – brainstorming and a 'can do' approach.

Green Hat is grass, vegetation and fertile growth. The green hat looks for the practical implementation of the creative 'yellow hat' ideas – a 'how can do' approach.

Black Hat is somber and serious. The black hat is cautious and careful. It points out the weaknesses in an idea and looks for risks and dangers – 'no can do' approach.

Red Hat suggests anger (seeing red) or positive emotions (red roses, red hearts). The red hat gives the emotional view.
